- A one-year membership in the Astronomical League. This includes all the publications that the Astronomical League provides to its members.
- Key-holders have access to society property and equipment for personal use or research in accordance with the policies established by the board or directors. Members who have demonstrated an active interest in astronomy, have volunteered for club events over a one-year period may become eligible for key-holder status.
